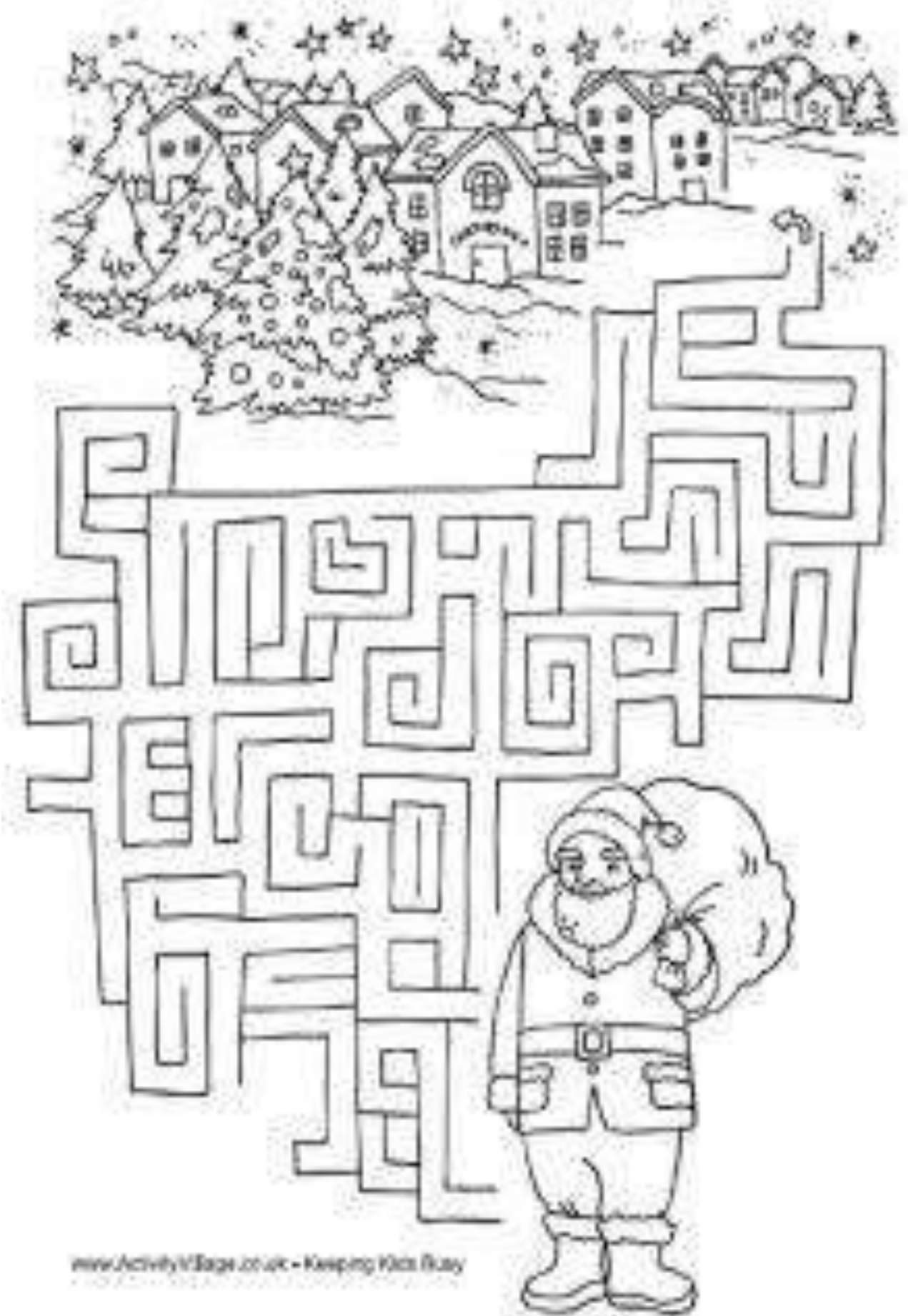

Caring for Animals during Extreme Heat

We all welcome the longer days and warmer weather that summer brings, but with shifting weather patterns and a trend towards higher temperatures, extreme heat is emerging as an issue for livestock and pets around Australia.

Managing animals in high temperatures requires good forward planning. Keeping an eye on the weather forecasts, and developing a plan for days of high to extreme temperature is essential in ensuring that your animals will have sufficient shade and water on those very hot days.

Cats, dogs and other pets

Always provide plenty of cool, clean water and shade for the animal. When away from home, carry a thermos filled with fresh, cool water.

Leave pets at home as much as possible. They will be much more comfortable in a cool home than riding in a hot car. If a pet must be taken along for the ride, don't leave it alone in a parked vehicle. Even with the windows open, a parked car can quickly become a furnace.

Don't force the animal to exercise in hot, humid weather. Exercise pets in the cool of the early morning or evening. In extremely hot weather, don't leave your dog standing on the street, and keep walks to a minimum. Because a dog is much closer to the hot asphalt, its body can heat up quickly, and its paws can sustain burns or injuries.

Animals can get sunburned too! Protect hairless and light-coated dogs and white cats with sunscreen when your animal will be outside in the sun for an extended period of time. Put sunscreen or zinc on exposed areas of pink skin. Animals with long coats can be clipped to increase comfort in hot weather.

Small animals such as rabbits and guinea pigs can become heat stressed when temperatures increase over 21°C so it is important that their enclosures are in the shade and that they have plenty of clean cool water.

Remember: The most important things you can do for your animals in hot weather is to provide them with rest and shade in the hottest parts of the day, and plenty of clean cool water.

You have a responsibility to ensure the well-being of animals under your care. With a bit of forward planning you can greatly increase the comfort and health of your animals during periods of hot weather.

Animal Welfare - it's your Duty to Care



Birds (including poultry)

Birds may show signs of heat stress such as:

- reluctance to move
- standing with head down
- squatting with wings spread
- reduced growth rates.

It is important to ensure caged birds are kept in a sheltered and cool spot and supplied with plentiful water.

Site and design your chicken coop or bird aviary in an area that is shaded from the sun and has good airflow. On hot days, ice cubes can be put in water bowls which will progressively melt to give birds fresh cool water.

If your birds are showing signs of heat stress, spraying them with water and creating a breeze with fans or mechanical ventilation can help to cool them. In extreme cases dunk them in a bucket of water to cool them.

DOGGONE, IT'S SUMMER!
Please keep your pets safe this summer. Dogs don't sweat like humans and can suffer **HEATSTROKE** for more easily.

Exercise your dog early or late in the day. All dogs, especially flat faced breeds can overheat quickly.

Check the temperature of the ground or sand because if it's too hot to touch, then it's **TOO HOT** for their **PAWS**.

Provide fresh water daily. Clean shallow pools and doggy ice treats/longs/home alone toys are great fun, keeps them cool and provides mental enrichment.

Leave dogs in a shady area, bearing in mind the movement of the sun as the day passes.

Never walk your dog when the temperature is over 30C (85F), their paws burn on hot pavement and hot sand.

Never leave your dog in a parked car on a warm day. Even on a cool day, the temperature in the car is much hotter than outside and can lead to brain damage or death!

SIGNS OF HEATSTROKE
Muddy pink gums (instead of bright pink), heavy panting with occasional huffing at the mouth, disorientation, increased heart rate.

What To Do: Remove the pet from the heat source if possible. Increase ventilation (fan) and apply cool water or a cool towel compress. Do not apply ice, this causes the blood vessels to constrict and takes the dog longer to cool down. Reapply the cool towels frequently. Offer water to your pet, but don't force it.
Get your pet to the veterinarian quickly.

Chocolate snowballs

Ingredients

- 200g dark chocolate, chopped
- 100g unsalted butter, chopped
- 3/4 cup (165g) caster sugar
- 3 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 1/2 cups (225g) plain flour
- 2 tbs cocoa powder
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1 cup (150g) icing sugar



Method

Step 1

Preheat the oven to 175°C. Line 2 baking trays with baking paper.

Step 2

Place the dark chocolate and chopped butter in a heatproof bowl over a pan of simmering water over low heat (make sure the bowl doesn't touch the water). Stir mixture until melted and smooth, then remove the bowl from the heat and stand for 5 minutes to cool.

Step 3

Using a wooden spoon, stir caster sugar into chocolate until dissolved. Gradually add eggs, stirring until well combined. Add vanilla, flour, cocoa and baking powder and mix until a smooth dough. Cover and chill for no more than 30 minutes to firm.

Step 4

Use hands to roll 2 level tablespoons of the dough into a ball. Repeat until you have 14 balls. Sift the icing sugar into a dish, then dip each ball into the dish and dust heavily in icing sugar and place on the prepared trays about 2cm apart. Bake the snowballs for 10-12 minutes until firm to the touch. Cool on the trays.

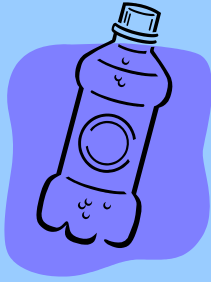

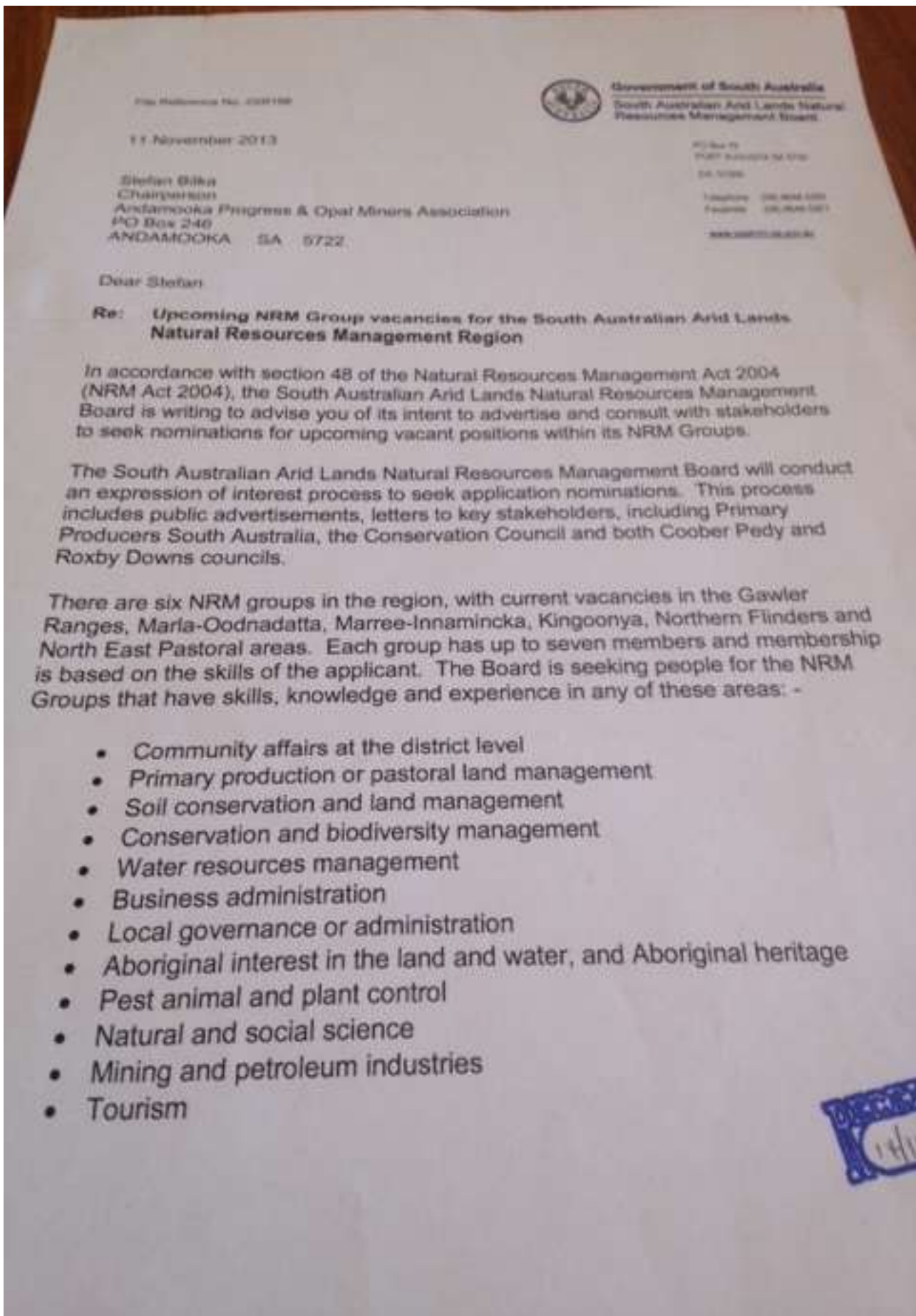


