ANDAMOOKA PROGRESS & OPAL MINERS ASSOC. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2024

APOMA held their AGM on Thursday 12th December 2024. The meeting originally scheduled for Sunday 23rd November was postponed on the day due to a major rain event which blocked access to the venue and kept many residents trapped in their homes.

The AGM, was attended by over 30 members and community, went well even if a little lively at times, with the annual report well accepted and adopted by members. Two items of interest to general community were passed by motion by the members after presentation, those being adoption of the new 2024-27 Town & Community Plan which will be presented with a comprehensive action plan at the annual APOMA Member and Community Meeting in March, and secondly support for the APOMA Committee to move ahead with acquisition of the old Mines Department Office to be converted to a community wellness centre. Members also approved donations to the RFDS & ACHWAG from APOMA fundraisers 2024.

The committee going into 2025 has welcomed two new members, being:

Paul Williams, nominated at the AGM, is a recently returned past resident who is keen to lift the scope of opal mining activities in Andamooka, and to see more community events and fundraising with opportunities for community connections and to provide funding to improve community services, already kicking off monthly community BBQ's at the cottages to raise funds for the RFDS.

Jim Middap is a recent Andamooka resident who was nominated for committee, and familiar to many locals for his community work in Roxby Downs, including as a member of Rotary, so he is experienced with working on community associations, and keen to get involved with APOMA community events and activities within Andamooka. He is a justice of the peace who will bring knowledge and experience to the table when working on committee.

Towards the end of the year there was a few changes with some members retiring from, and others seconded on to, committee. Active member for around 6 years, Rodney Mitchell will be greatly missed on his retirement. His input at meetings and assistance and involvement in community events and programs has been valuable, and he was also a member of the finance team and Arts and ACHWAG sub groups. Our thanks goes out to Rodney, who will be spending more time away from town to care for his wife Claudia, who was also a member of the committee before Rodney.

John Smirnios stood down at the end of his term, and Corrie Ferguson resigned midway through his term. Previous Chair Ian Thompson, was seconded onto Committee for a short time leading up to the AGM to assist with various matters with which he has experience, and retired at the AGM. Kath Wilby, APOMA public officer, was also seconded onto the committee to assist continuity with addressing matters carrying over into 2025.

Committee nominations for three new Life Members were accepted with this honour going to APOMA members in recognition of their commitment and dedication to community which has resulted in legacies for community development, medical and emergency services, and for development and promotion of the broad arts in Andamooka which is on-going today. Recipients are past long-term APOMA Chair, Stefan Bilka, Diane Bilka and Heather Gordon. By the votes on the night, these were definitely popular choices by both members and community present.

Fast & Easy surveys focus on a series of great ideas put forward by community members such as:


- Outdoor fitness equipment at the pump track


